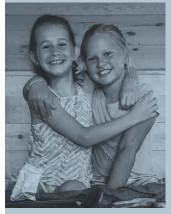

In fact, much to the dismay of the religious types of his day, Jesus was constantly pointing to ousiders as the heros of his stories, as examples of faith and love. Think about all the flawed outsiders God chose to be a part of God's story: David was a murderer. Samson was an arrogant womanizer. John the Baptist ate bugs and hollered in the wilderness. Noah was a drunk. Abraham was too old. Mary was too young. Peter denied him. Jacob a liar. Jonah ran away. And Martha was a worry-wart. These people clearly had issues! First, when we commit ourselves to creating **worship** experiences that welcome insiders as well as those who didn't grow up in the church or have had bad experiences with church, we create the opportunity to welcome people into a lifelong faith. When we invite our friends and neighbors to worship, it offers the possibility for them to experience something maybe they've never experienced before in a church. Second, we want all to know the life-changing difference being surrounded by a group of people who love you and love God can make. The best way we know to do this is through **Connect** Groups or small groups, because when it comes to growth in faith, circles are always better than rows! Life is simply better when you are connected. And finally, we want all to ultimately put their faith in action in ways that **serve** our community and beyond. We want to be a church with big hands and big feet.

As you look at our annual report, again this year it is organized around these three key components of our mission because they are at the heart of what we seek to do and be. As we embark on another year of ministry, I'm so thankful that I get to be a part of a church that is boldly reminding our community that there are no outsiders to God's love!

CALVARY IS MAKING A DIFFERENCE!

- 2 Seminary students. Calvary's Endowment Fund pays their tuition and will do the same for Calvary members who follow God's call to ministry! Another 4 members are currently considering seminary.
- 4 unique worship services each week. We are one church, many espressions.
- **33** students & adults traveled to Guatemala and the National Youth Gathering in Houston, Texas this past summer!
- **60** baptisms were held at Calvary over the past year!

- **503** quilts were sewn by hand and donated to Lutheran World Relief, & more than 1,000 mission kits were packed and shipped globally.
- 728 people gather for worship each week on average at Calvary.
- **1,000** tax returns were prepared through West Central Community Action's free tax preparation service held at Calvary!
- 2,149 members consider Calvary their church home!
- **4,800** bags of food packed for hungry students through our Backpack Attack program!
- **\$20,000** was given to support Lutheran World Relief in Bihar, India, totaling \$60,000 over 3 years!
- **\$26,855** was donated to worthy organizations in our community by Calvary's Endowment Fund.

EXECUTIVE PASTOR CALL COMMITTEE REPORT

Calvary has been actively seeking a pastor for the past year. We are looking for someone to fill the role of Executive Pastor, and this person will have traditional responsibilities of preaching, pastoral care, weddings and funerals, but will also focus on overseeing the program ministry and staff that help fulfill our mission: to lead all people to a lifelong faith in Jesus.

What we know is that this is a time of tremendous pastoral shortages in the ELCA. Currently for every 400 pastors retiring annually, there are only 200 entering the field. There are 9,128 congregations and only 6,041 pastors at this time. With that said, we knew that entering into the call process would be a lengthy search.

The Call Committee interviewed candidates this past spring, and for various reasons none of the candidates remained in the pool. Under the direction of the Church Council, Calvary hired the search firm SIMA Partners, led by a man named Rick Heltne, to conduct a search of candidates and present us with a qualified pool. Rick has been busy recruiting and vetting candidates. Once the pool of qualified candidates is identified, Calvary's Call Committee will conduct interviews and take the process through to completion.

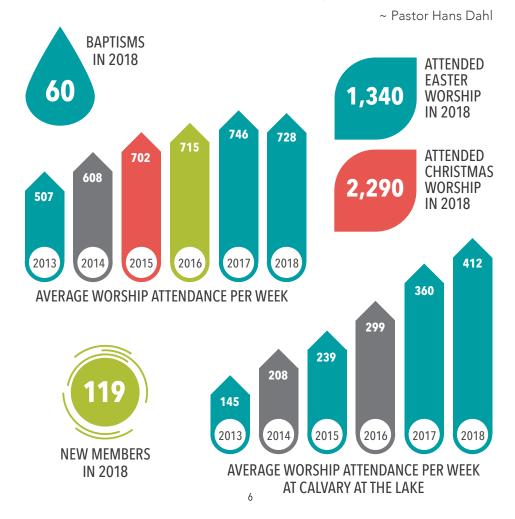
Calvary is an attractive community, and this is a fantastic leadership position, but the reality is that the pool of qualified candidates is smaller than we'd hope for finding someone quickly. For years, Calvary has taken great pride in raising up our own and being able to support seminary education for our members through the Endowment Fund. Come January, we will have two members of the congregation attending seminary, and we know there are several others considering and applying. As Calvary is seeking a pastor, we are also working to send more into the field.

Please continue to be prayerful about this pastoral role, that the right person feels called and that the other things that need to fall into place to support a move happen as well. The Call Committee looks forward to sharing more with you in the coming months.

Here are some highlights:

- Through the meaningful worship series we've had we continue to connect worship and people together.
- We purchased a new sound system for Calvary at the Lake and infrastructure needed to provide an even more welcoming experience all summer long. We also had record breaking worship attendance that made a difference in so many lives!
- This fall we introduced new elements into the worship and music for all services. We have all kinds of wonderful special music groups for traditional worship with new liturgies for this beautiful and meaningful service. We're continuing to work on modern worship and tweak it as we create a service engaging and relevant to connect with more and more people.
- December was a busy month! The traditional Lessons and Carols as well as a modern spin on it were both highlights for me. We held two new events featuring Calvary musicians; Kids & Carols and Carols & Cocktails, out at the beautiful Gathered Oaks Event Center. These two events set the tone for what was to come at Christmas at Calvary. We ended the year with 7 Christmas services, including a preview for folks traveling, and almost 2,300 people came through the doors to worship our newborn king.

During 2018, we expanded the resources available for Connect Groups, and several groups have used an online resource/app called "Anthology" which offers 10-20 minute videos for groups to stream and discussion questions to follow. While some groups still prefer to use a book or printed Bible study, these topical video studies are helpful options for leaders who have limited time to prepare each week. Groups of parents can have faith-based conversations about raising kids. Married couples have time to talk about the role faith plays in their marriage. Connecting in this way is so important for people, and I'm proud that Calvary continues to lift up its importance.

CHILDREN & STUDENT MINISTRIES

We've had a fantastic 2018 and we have so much to be thankful for in Children and Student Ministry at Calvary! We spent quite a bit of time this summer working on implementing the new school year curriculum for all of our children and students, ages 2 through 18, as well as planning and having Vacation Bible School. What an incredible week with over 230 kids learning about what God is #FOR!



This fall we welcomed students of all ages to worship, connect, and serve! Starting at age two, JAM (Jesus and Me) breaks down bible teachings into age appropriate songs, fun video stories that the kids LOVE, and engaging activities. For 2-4 year olds, Sundays at 10:45am.



Our traditional Sunday School hour, 9:45am on Sundays, now called DIG (Delight in God) shifted in the fall. This ministry for K-3rd graders moved the kids downstairs and implemented bible videos and lessons surrounding key themes like contentment, initiative, and cooperation. In December we held our first annual Kids and Carols at Gathered Oaks for kids and their families to celebrate Christmas as a Calvary community! Again we were blessed with amazing volunteers who are the driving force behind Children and Student Ministries!



Last year we began a preteen ministry, for 4-5th graders and this year IMPACT continues to grow and wow us with its incredible volunteer leaders! They do monthly service projects like making blankets for Love Inc, Santa for Seniors, and writing letters to veterans. Along with our new curriculum they follow a preteen specific lesson plan, helping to further reach each child at their phase as they gather each Wednesday at 5pm.



ELEVATE, formerly ConfirMission, is a ministry for middle school students, 6-9th graders each Wednesday after worship at 7pm. We are blown away every week at the commitment by each leader to show up consistently and fully for their students. This year we are putting more focus on small groups. With specific series and lesson plans students and their leaders are able to go deeper in their faith and with each other as they create a vulnerable and safe environment for everyone. The biggest highlight from ELEVATE this year was small group service week. Each small group planned and executed their own service project after Thanksgiving. From baking cookies for Advent Cheer Boxes, to buying a bike for the Giving Tree, each group made a huge impact on the community. We had groups reach out to other members of the church and work together using Thrivent Action Grants to provide coats and winter gear for kids in our community in need. On October 28, we celebrated 31 students confirming their baptism in Christ.



We are strongly encouraging the students that are going to high school to become involved in FUSE—our high school ministry. This year, they are meeting once a month as a connect group to talk about topics that pertain to their lives and growing in their faith before they leave for jobs or college.

I feel fortunate that I was able to take a step back after my son was born in September, and I'm so grateful to Jennie Hodgson for stepping up, but am very much looking forward to returning to work. We continue to be amazed by the willingness of parents and volunteers to be small group leaders for these kids; influencing these kids faith lives in great ways, walking alongside and equipping parents to lead their children in a lifelong faith. We are looking forward to 2019 with much excitement and anticipation for what God is doing in this place through these children, students and connect group leaders.

- Keeping the **library** organized and current.

We have two major fund-raising events—**Höst Fest and Advent Brunch.** Countless hours and a tremendous amount of energy is put into all that it takes to sponsor both of these events. As in previous years, we had a wonderful turnout of people eager to buy the food, treats, purchase a chance for the beautiful quilt and enjoy the delicious salad/meatball luncheon at Höst Fest. The Advent Brunch committee active advertisement resulted in a crowd over of 200 friends and guests. A special thank you to the Calvary men who helped clean up and did dishes and provided babysitting.

Throughout the year the Women of Calvary donated **over \$10,000 in cash and goods** to a variety of causes including Luther Crest, Calvary Preschool, Titus2Ministry, pastor's discretionary fund, Lutheran World Relief, Lutheran Disaster Relief, Someplace Safe and Socks for Souls/Love Inc.

We were also able to donate an additional **\$5,000 (\$1,000 each)** to Elder Network, West Central Community Action Fund, Alexandria Tech food shelf and Alexandria High School food shelf and Someplace Safe.

We remain committed to United Way's Christmas Adopt-A-Family program and collected **324 Giving Tree gifts**. A group of 10 volunteers from Calvary has faithfully organized this project for the past several years.



Calvary serves as the fiscal agent for The Shelf at Alexandria Area High School and collects food in the fall through our Green Bag collection. The Advisory Committee of social workers, teachers, and Calvary members met regularly to assess needs and make sure food, school supplies, and personal care items were getting to students who need them most. Both the Calvary community and the wider Alexandria community have given **\$14,725** generously supporting the Shelf this past year.

In November, Elevate Connect Groups shopped for winter gear for local elementary schools, wrote cards to Calvary's elders, and baked cookies for Cheer Boxes. Serving is an important part of our identity as people of faith.



During January of 2018, Katie Dahl and Julie Anderson had the opportunity to visit Bihar, India with a delegation from Lutheran World Relief. The group met women and visited their farms and cooperatives, seeing firsthand the difference this project has already made in their lives. Calvary's **donation of \$20,000** to the Bihar partnership will greatly affect the next generation of farming communities in that region of India.

CARING MINISTRIES

My name is Paige Good. I am the Caring Minister here at Calvary Lutheran Church. I have many titles that I am proud of—wife, mom, daughter, sister, Christian, aunt, friend...but, Caring Minister is one that embraces who I have been since I was a little girl. I love to love people. And fortunately this is my job now, I get to love people at Calvary, and in our community, helping lead people to a lifelong faith—it's a real gift.

I typically split my time between the local care facilities, Grand Arbor, Bethany, Knute Nelson, and others. I visit those hospitalized. Pastor Nathan and I take communion to Grand Arbor, Bethany and Windmill Ponds the third week of each month. Caring Ministry also runs a program called Friendly Visitors, which connects current members with members that are not able to get to church, they check in with their members as much or as little as they want...the connection is amazing!

This year we launched Prime Time, a gathering for those 65 and better in the community. We had 130 people at our first event! In addition, I oversee Senior Coffee, an informal time for Senior members of our congregation to socialize with the Calvary staff. During the month of December, we made a special effort to visit as many of our elder member as possible, with students, friendly visitors and staff alike, visiting well over 100 members, delivering meal baskets, gifts and Cheer Boxes. Two more programs I am delighted to oversee: First, Calvary Baby Basket program delivers a basket of goodies along with a handmade baby quilt to new mothers in our church family. We had 60 Baptisms this year. Wow! Second, the Prayer Shawl ministry allows me and our pastors to deliver prayer shawls to members who are sick or ailing. God is doing so much through our church family. So grateful and excited to be part of the magic that is happening at Calvary!

CALVARY PRESCHOOL

Calvary Lutheran Preschool has been a vital preschool program in Alexandria for 28 years! We are excited to serve 79 families this year in a variety of classes. We have three year old programming one or two mornings per week. Our four year olds have three or four mornings, or two afternoons per week as options. Any student can participate in early morning drop off or afternoon enrichment if the family is interested.

Teachers guide students to experience the well prepared environments and activities in the classes. Social skills and pre-academics provide a curriculum structure to inform our teaching. We are looking forward to offering some new options for families next year with enhanced curriculum with a rich literacy base including many beloved Bible stories.

Thank you to the Endowment Committee for their generous donation for us to purchase additional curriculum for our children. We know best practice is to have a variety of resources to individualize learning for each student. We are proud to market Calvary Lutheran Preschool as a Christian, developmentally appropriate place where children can thrive and begin their journey of lifelong faith in Jesus.

C SUPPORTING OUR MISSION & VISION

TREASURER'S REPORT

The faithfulness of Calvary members and their generous financial support allows Calvary to continue to grow. Calvary's General Fund Worship Income has grown 53 percent over the past five years, from 2014-2018. This continued growth has only been possible through members' financial giving as well as their gifts of time and talent. All of these gifts allow Calvary to reach within and serve the congregation members with worship and ministries, as well as reach out into the community.

Key 2018 financial observations:

- While the reported 2018 Total General Fund Income of \$1,084,217 is down about \$9,000 from 2017, it is important to recognize that several 2018 member pledges were paid in December 2017 for personal reasons. If these pledges were adjusted from 2017 to 2018 income, Calvary's Total General Fund Income was over 4 percent above 2017 and \$6,300 over budget.
- Total General Expenses slightly exceeded General Fund Income by \$126, however expenses were over \$20,000 below budget.
- Total 2018 Benevolence and Donations were \$109,428, over 11 percent of reported Worship Income. Calvary had over \$228,000 in Designated Funds donations. A large portion of the 2018 Designated Funds Income was from members who chose to give towards the potential building renovation & expansion.
- Calvary's General Fund Reserve checking year-end balance was \$205,000.

Calvary is in a strong financial position as we move into 2019. While the income growth has been positive and the General Fund Reserve is in a healthy position, it is also critical to manage expenses. The 2019 budget has been carefully constructed together with staff to support the congregation within our financial means, and as we look forward to years ahead. Thank you for your generous support of financial gifts, time, and talent as we move forward into the new church year.

BUILDING PLANNING TEAM REPORT

Since 1885, the people of Calvary Lutheran Church (then called Svea Lutheran) have been following the call to share God's love in the community. Throughout Calvary's history, the people have recognized the need to expand, modernize, and build in order to ensure something they believed to be absolutely critical: that Calvary provided a space where all are welcome and invited to hear the story of God's love for them!

We wonder again, is God inviting us to say once more "Now is the Time!"?

The ReNew project in 2013 focused on maintenance of the facility, and from that the Building Exploration Team was formed to study the building and explore the need for remodel and expansion in 2017. In 2018, the congregation saw very preliminary drawings of a potential concept and approved moving forward with the Building Planning Team and Financial Feasibility Team to further develop the concept and gather more information on the financial capacity of the congregation for such a project. We identified the need to address deferred maintenance issues, and create spaces that allow us to worship, connect, and serve in more efficient and meaningful ways.

Both in August/September and November of 2018, the building and financial teams held forums and shared what has been learned through the studies and feedback sessions, as well as revealed further developed concepts of what the renovations and expansion could look like.

The work of the Church Council, Building Planning and Financial Feasibility Teams have reached a point at which we need further permission from the congregation to move forward. Another round of forums will happen in January in order to share information that will be helpful in casting a vote at the Annual Congregation Meeting on January 27, 2019 at 9:30 am in the Sanctuary. At this meeting, we will be asking members present to vote on taking a next step: to further develop the renovation concepts to a point that will give us concrete cost estimates. Council will seek approval to:

- Move forward with the conceptual design recommended by the Building Planning Team.
- Spend up to \$85,000 of dollars already donated to the project to complete work needed to further develop cost estimates, including continued work with JLG Architects, soil boring tests, audio/visual/lighting consultants, and financial coaching.
- Allow the Building Planning Team to interview and recommend a builder to the congregation who will assist in refining cost estimates.
- Authorize the Financial Feasibility Team to prepare for a potential appeal during summer/fall of 2019.
- Convene another congregation meeting in May 2019 to address next steps in the proposed project.

We can't wait for all God has in store for our church family in the coming year - Now is the Time!

The Endowment Fund stands at \$281,775 as of 12/31/18. Investment returns this year have been negative owning to a down year on the Stock Market. Looked at over a longer time period however, the funds has had an average return of 8.4%. The next page shows the gifts made from the fund this year. It is encouraging to note that during this 21st century the fund has donated over \$625,000 to a variety of worthy causes, including over \$200,000 to help fund tuition costs of Calvary members attending Seminary.
