

Seriously. I can't thank you enough.

Why? Because I have a hunch I know how you'd answer the following question: What is the faith of the next generation worth? What is the faith of your children or grandchildren worth? What is the faith of your friend or neighbor worth? Sister or brother? Best friend or spouse?

WHY DO I ASK THIS QUESTION? BECAUSE THE REALITIES OF CHURCH IN AMERICA ARE STAGGERING:

Between 1930's and 1980's, 68-70% of Americans were members of churches.
 But get this: Since 1999, church membership in America has fallen by 20%.
 Just 50% belong to a church. Amongst millennials, 42% are members of churches, while 33% have no religious affiliation. ("U.S. Church Membership Down Sharply in Past Two Decades," Jeffrey Jones, www.gallup.com)

A RECENT STORY FROM LUTHER SEMINARY IN ST. PAUL, THE LARGEST OF OUR LUTHERAN SEMINARIES, REPORTED THE FOLLOWING:

- Currently, the total average weekly worship attendance at U.S. churches of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America (ELCA) is 899,000. Given the current trends, by 2041 - in just 20 years - that number is projected to drop to 15,811. That's a 98% decline.
- Today, there are 3,458,839 members of ELCA churches. That number is projected to drop to 66,540. Again, a decline of 98%. ("Will the ELCA be Gone in 30 Years?", Dwight Zscheile, www.faithlead.luthersem.edu/ decline/)

We all know this is real, because we've all experienced it. We all know a son or a daughter, a husband or a wife, uncle or aunt, neighbor or friend who has walked away from the church. Who have said, "enough." We all know a loved one who was bored or hurt or turned off by the church.

Because of this, I know how you would answer my question:

#### WHAT IS THE FAITH OF THE NEXT GENERATION WORTH?

You'd say the same thing I would: It is worth everything. It's worth any change necessary to ensure that our kids and grandkids and friends and the people you know and love—that they know the faith that gives us hope and peace and joy.

I know it's worth everything to you.

Do you know why I know this? Calvary is a church that is defying odds. Worship attendance has grown by 40% since 2013. We have 100's of adults growing deeper in Connect Groups and Circles. We welcome over 300 kids to vacation Bible school. Each Wednesday night a modern worship service welcomes an average of 200 students and parents. And over this past year, you pledged over \$4 million dollars in financial and in-kind gifts to the "Now is the Time" Appeal that will ensure we have space to welcome even more. As one elder member put it: "This isn't about me. This is about those we don't even know yet, and those who haven't been born yet."

It's worth it.

It is worth everything.

Thank you. Seriously, thank you. I'm so honored to serve as your pastor.

## From Calvary's President

#### Dear Calvary Family!

All around the church these days, there's an exciting level of enthusiasm, not just for where we've been, but even more for what's next! Since Calvary was founded 143 years ago, God has said again and again, "Now is the time, Calvary!" And, every time Calvary responded great things have happened. This year was no exception!

- Building for the future... we made a monumental congregation-wide decision to commence a \$6 million renovation and expansion project to give us the right kind of space needed to lead more people to a lifelong faith.
- Growing our capacity for ministry... Executive Minister, Angie Larson, joined our team to oversee and expand our Caring Ministry, Kid and Student Ministry, as well as our Service Ministries teams.
- Raising up new leaders... we have 8 members who are attending Seminary and we are also exploring partnerships that will give students experience under Calvary mentorship.
- Connecting in new ways... in December we broadcasted a Calvary Unplugged service online and it was viewed over 3,500 times! Our online presence is growing.
- Serving God's people... 1000's of Backpack Attack bags were packed, \$1000's were given to The Shelf, and we concluded our 3-year \$60,000 partnership in Bihar, India.

In Exodus, God had a vision to lead the people to a promised land, but it took Moses and the Israelites working together to organize that logistically massive move of 2 million people. In Acts, the gospel went out to all nations, but it didn't spread by itself - it took the strategic efforts of missionary-minded people like Paul and Barnabas. Here's what I know: The vision comes from God, but the faithful and sometimes challenging work of realizing a vision happens when God's people learn to move, serve, stretch and do ministry in new ways together. God is again saying, "Now is the time!" I'm so thankful for the huge steps we took this year so that more and more might know the joy, hope and peace of the faith we know.

I've never been more excited about the future of our church. I'm honored to serve as Calvary's president and I'm in awe of your faithful dedication to our mission: ...to lead all people to a lifelong faith in Jesus Christ!



LIFE IS BETTER CONNECTED

Calvary, you continue to catch the vision around the importance of connecting with one another in order to grow deeper in faith! During 2019, we had several opportunities for Connect Groups to form. Because there isn't one model that fits all groups, I meet with group leaders individually to find something that works best for their groups. For example, we have a new young adult Connect Group that watches videos to launch them into conversations focused on finding purpose in their lives, relationships, and careers. Another group of women meets weekly and discusses a book that they rotate choosing. This same group initiated their own service project by meeting outside of their regularly scheduled time to deliver food baskets for Jingle Bells. Several groups of empty nesters get together to share monthly meals, which has helped them form friendships and find ways to care for each other. This fall, a group formed at Grand Arbor, and they discuss the Bible lessons and sermon they heard the previous weekend in worship. This is all happening in addition to the Women's Circles, GIFT, Women's Bible Study, and Men's Bible Study which have faithfully met for many years. I look forward to expanding available resources, leader training opportunities, and group formation times in the coming year.




### **Kid & Student Ministries**

2019 for Kid and Student Ministry at Calvary has proven to be an amazing year of growth, learning together and lots of fun!

















Wednesday nights are a whirlwind of student ministry and worship—in the very best way! Impact for 4th and 5th graders meets from 5:15-6:00pm before worship and Elevate and FUSE have been meeting from 7:00-7:45pm after worship. Impact has had a great fall with service projects such as writing letters to veterans and santa for seniors as well as learning about ways to build their friendships and what it means to be a leader. I couldn't ask for better volunteers than the women that run Impact—they are rockstars! Elevate has had an awesome year learning and doing service projects as well. A couple examples of their service projects include packing school supplies, writing cards to people in prison for Christmas, and delivering goodie baskets to our neighbors to wish them Merry Christmas and thanks for their patience during our construction phase! I'm also so grateful to the Elevate leaders who show up consistently for these groups of students.

FUSE, our high school ministry, took on a new look this fall with Angie guiding them in some leadership skills, then breaking into small groups with awesome leaders and it has been great! We've averaged 15 kids each week and look forward to continuing with this group in the new year!

#### SOME OTHER HIGHLIGHTS FROM 2019 INCLUDE:

- Over 300 kids ages 2-18 participate in our various kid & student ministries.
- Vacation Bible School welcomed 300 kids and 100 leaders this summer, and one-third of those kids were new to Calvary!
- About 90 adults participated as mentors to middle school students as part of Elevate on Wednesday nights.
- We took 15 high school students and 7 adults on a Houseboat Trip to Rainy Lake this summer, and can't wait to do it again.
- Faith milestones were celebrated with 17 kids receiving first communion and 24 students being confirmed.
- About 150 kids and their families celebrated Christmas at our Kids & Carols event, including Calvary Preschool families.

We have big plans for 2020 and we can't wait to be in the new spaces for kids and student ministry when the building project is complete! It will be a great year of continuing to grow and learn together as we lead all people to a lifelong faith in Jesus!

- Funeral Meals served.
- Knitting and crocheting of prayer shawls and baptismal blankets.
- Knitted baby blankets (150) donated to Alomere Hospital and Life Connections.
- Monthly "coffees" held at Ecumen Bethany Community.
- Keeping the **library** organized and current.

**Spring Celebration, Höst Fest and Advent Brunch were our three major fund-raising and connect events.** The Spring Celebration was indeed welcome after a long, long winter! As in previous years, we had a wonderful turnout of people eager to buy the food, treats, purchase a chance for the beautiful quilt and enjoy the delicious salad/meatball luncheon at Höst Fest. The Advent Brunch welcomed in a crowd over of 150 friends and guests. A special thank you to the Calvary men who helped clean up and wash dishes.

Throughout the year the Women of Calvary donated **over \$7,000** in **cash and goods** to a variety of causes including Luther Crest Camperships, Calvary Preschool, Safe Harbor, Lutheran World Relief, Lutheran Disaster Relief, and Laughing Buddha Meditation.

We were also able to pledge **\$7,000** to the building renovation project earmarked for kitchen furnishings.

# SERVE WE CAN DO MORE TOGETHER



Calvary is a Live United partner at United Way of Douglas and Pope Counties, contributing \$13,500 during 2019. We hosted 4 food packing events that engaged people of all ages and packed thousands of bags of food. In November, United Way asked Calvary to assist with their community packing event for the second year in a row. Calvary volunteers proudly wore their green "We Can Do More Together" t-shirts and helped pack another 1,000 Thanksgiving break bags.



We remain committed to United Way's Christmas Adopt-A-Family program as well and collected **300 Giving Tree gifts**. A group of 10 volunteers from Calvary has faithfully organized this project for the past several years.



Calvary continues to serve as the fiscal agent for The Shelf at Alexandria Area High School. This fall, we collected food through our Green Bag collection as a part of the Reclaim the Table series. Through mug sales, we also raised additional funds for The Shelf. The Advisory Committee of social workers, teachers, and Calvary members met regularly to assess needs and make sure food, school supplies, and personal care items were getting to students who need them most.

This year we completed our support of the Bihar partnership with Lutheran World Relief, and we packed thousands of bags of food for elementary students through United Way's Backpack Attack program. Elevate Connect Groups helped with service throughout the year as well, doing things like assembling LWR school kits, packing snack bags for local schools, and delivering treats to neighbors around the church. Serving on all levels is an important part of our identity.



Calvary gave its final donation of \$10,000 to the Lutheran World Relief Bihar partnership during 2019. Over three years, the church and endowment committee contributed a total of \$60,000 to help eradicate hunger in the Bihar region of India. Although we will continue to receive updates from LWR about the progress being made, they have sent us many positive updates from communities who received support. Children are healthier, women are receiving training, and crop yields are increasing.

## **Calvary Preschool**

Calvary Lutheran Preschool is a vibrant ministry of Calvary Lutheran Church for the past 29 years. We are committed to creating a Christian atmosphere in which social emotional skills, spiritual growth, physical development and developmentally appropriate pre-academic opportunities are of the utmost importance. This year we provided an outstanding preschool experience for 68 families. Programming for three year olds was offered two days per week either morning or afternoon half days. Four year old classes included three days per week—morning half days OR full days, OR afternoon half days. Families could participate in early morning drop off if interested.

Our licensed and experienced teachers observed students in all they did to inform our teaching. They provided guidance, encouragement and well prepared lessons, as the children navigated the excellent learning environment. Students practiced and learned self-help skills, social skills and pre-academics with our new literacy based curriculum. Each day also included devotions and beloved Bible stories. Thank you again to the Endowment Committee for their generous donation last year for us to purchase great curriculum for our children. We are proud to individualize learning for each child as they begin preparing for kindergarten. We are proud to market Calvary Lutheran Preschool as a Christian, developmentally appropriate place where children can thrive and begin their journey of lifelong faith in Jesus

# Now Is The Time Building Expansion & Renovation Report

#### WHAT'S HAPPENED?

A lot has changed on Calvary's property since the historic congregational vote on October 13, 2019! With resounding support from the congregation, the work on the property has begun. All the work being done is for the purpose of making sure that we have enough space and the right kind of space where all people can experience a growing relationship with Jesus Christ through worshipping, connecting and serving.

#### **HIGHLIGHTS OF FALL 2019 WORK INCLUDE:**

- Foundations laid for expansion to the south
- Mechanical systems rerouted
- Second floor demolition









#### WHAT'S COMING UP?

The property will continue to evolve over 2020. While the timeline is subject to change, the current general construction flow is listed below. We can't wait for all God has in store for our church family in the coming year—Now is the Time!

#### WINTER

- Erect the expansion on the south end of lot
- Complete renovations of second floor for new staff offices and two multipurpose rooms

#### **SPRING**

- Convert main level Svea wing into Calvary Preschool
- Add restrooms and preschool classroom to courtyard

#### **SUMMER**

- Connect the expansion to the existing building
- Finish renovations on main level

#### FALL

• Construction completed

## Stewardship Report

In the fall of 2019, the fifth annual General Fund Stewardship Commitment Challenge was incorporated with the Now is the Time Appeal. This stewardship campaign was designed to fund our ongoing General Fund for both operations support and the further development of ministry activities related to the church's mission: to lead all people to a lifelong faith in Jesus Christ.

Commitments for 2020 were a record high this year, with more households committing and over \$100,000 more pledged than the previous year. Our stewardship commitments allow us to project a significant portion of our General Fund income in 2020 as Calvary continues to move forward with its vision to worship, connect, and serve. Automatic giving continues to grow, comprising almost one-third of all worship income received. In 2019 we had 175 households giving recurring automatic gifts. ## **Now Is The Time Financial Summary**

Calvary's Now is the Time Building Renovation & Expansion Appeal began in the summer and fall of 2019 to raise necessary funds for the project. With a goal of securing \$5 million in pledges, we invited the congregation to participate. The support was overwhelming, and we are grateful to all those who have made a commitment to the project. At the end of 2019, we had received commitments from 302 households for a total of \$3,914,950.

The chart below indicates both the income received and expenses to the project as of January 10, 2020. We celebrate that up to this point we have been using cash to pay all expenses for the project. Thank you, people of Calvary, for your incredible generosity that has made this possible! ## Treasurer's Report

Looking back on 2019, and forward to 2020 we can do so with pride and confidence. Worship attendance continues to grow and along with it so does the faithful financial support of Calvary's congregation. Ministry and programs continue to expand and grow. In addition, in 2019 the congregation faithfully committed support of a building renovation and expansion project. Thanks to a faithful and generous congregation, Calvary is alive and in a solid financial position.

#### **KEY 2019 FINANCIAL OBSERVATIONS:**

- We celebrate over \$2 million in congregation gifts in 2019. \$995,567 in General Fund Worship Income and \$981,568 in building project donations make up the majority. Though the 2019 General Fund Worship income was below budget, the Worship Income was up nearly two percent over 2018.
- An excellent job was done by Calvary staff in budgeting and controlling expenses through the year. Total expenses were on target with the 2019 budget. Excluding a one-time historical accounting correction, total expenses would have come in under budget and less than one percent above 2018.
- \$109,571 in 2019 Benevolence and Donations was 11 percent of 2019 Worship Income.
- Calvary's General Fund checking account reserve 2019 year-end balance was \$208,529.
- In October 2019 Calvary's congregation approved a nearly \$6.9 million dollar 'Now Is The Time' building expansion project and financing engagement. Congregation giving units have pledged over \$3.9 million toward the project. \$1,176,491 in pledges have already been paid.
- \$950,232 in building expansion project expenses (construction, professional fees, campaign costs, etc.) have been paid to date with no borrowing required.
- The 'Now Is The Time' building project account year-end balance was \$386,795 and Calvary enters 2020 with no debt.

Looking forward to 2020, Worship Income is projected to grow 6.5 percent and Total Income 2.5 percent. Staff has been careful in budgeting expenses and will continue to monitor them closely. With everyone working together, Calvary is in a healthy position to continue moving forward in its mission to *lead all people to a lifelong faith in Jesus Christ*. Thank you for your generous support of financial gifts, time, and talent as we move forward into the new church year and watch our ministry grow and our facilities expand.
